-Notices of Medicare number compromise due to a data breach.

-Bills from medical providers for services you did not receive. -Rejection of legitimate medical claims due to benefits limit reached.

-Health plan denial due to false conditions in your medical records.

GUARD YOUR MAIL & PACKAGES FROM PORCH PIRATES! -Mail should not sit in your mailbox for an extended period.

-If away from home, suspend your mail delivery.

-Opt-out of credit offers arriving in your USPS mailbox.

-Don't leave mail for the carrier; use USPS boxes instead.

-Use informed delivery: Digital Preview Mail.

-Shred mail into micro pieces.




